
Objective......S2 of the Trade Practices Act

- Understand the level of non compliance
- Recognise the sector risks
- Combine levels
- Engage the industry
- Without the top it is not a pyramid!





 Cooperation/Leniency Policies deliver both enforcement cases and education opportunities



Lessons learned

- No one part of the pyramid can operate in isolation
- Enforcement action is vital invest in complementary tactics
- Fully utilise enforcement outcomes public record of undertakings, court actions etc
- Careful and consistent selection of remedy is critical
- Engagement of industry is helpful but not always forthcoming
